#### Online vs Paper Entry Primary Limits:

PAC is accepting online entries through the [www.R2AgilityOnline.com](http://www.R2AgilityOnline.com) website for this trial. You will create an account and add your dog's information, then you can either generate a paper entry (that automatically calculates the total entry fees) to mail with a check or pay online. A 10% fee will be charged for all online entries. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries will be as follows: Online Entries: 33% (230) / Paper entries: 67% (470). If either type of entry (online or paper) has not filled at the end of the 48-hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either the online or paper limits accordingly.

#### Paper entries received within 24 hours of the opening date & time limit must:

- 1) Include postage or be metered. No hand deliveries in the first 24 hours.
- 2) Be delivered by a multi-state or multi-national postage or carrier service, including but not limited to USPS, FedEx, UPS & DHL. If above conditions are not met, the entries are not valid and must be returned to the sender.
- 3) Express mail must be designated "no signature required".

A 100% refund of the entry fee will be given for any bitch that comes into season with written notification from a veterinarian provided to the Trial Secretary.

## WALK-THROUGH & WARM-UP

Handlers in all classes will be permitted to walk the course without a dog prior to the start of the class. At the discretion of the judge, if the size of the entry for any class might inhibit a safe and fair walk-through by handlers, height divisions may be used to divide the walk-through into groups, e.g. walk-through for the 8", 12" and 16" division handlers followed by runs for those height divisions; then walk-through and subsequent runs for the 20", 24" and 24C" divisions. A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be provided. Umbrellas are not allowed on the course during the walk through.

## CLASSES OFFERED & JUDGING TIMES

### Classes Offered

All levels of Standard STD, JWW, FAST and T2B, including the preferred classes, will be offered according to the entry form. (International Sweepstakes Classes will be offered when indicated in the premium and on the entry form). A complete set of rules for all classes is available from the American Kennel Club, 8051 Arco Corporate Drive, Suite 100, Raleigh, NC 27617-3390, or from the AKC web site. **It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enter their dog in the correct class.** The Trial Secretary cannot make any changes (except for move-ups as noted) after the closing date of the trial. Be sure to check your entry form carefully and make certain you have entered the correct class(es).

### Move-ups, Errors, Confirmation Protocols

Move-ups after entries close must be submitted to the trial secretary in writing (mail or email) by **6 pm, Pacific time, Monday, April 13, 2026**. Requests for move-ups over the phone **will not be accepted**. Day-to-day move-ups will be accepted at the trial. Move-ups must be submitted on the move-up form provided, to the trial secretary no later than 30 minutes after completion of the last class of the day.

## OBSTACLES AND EQUIPMENT

Obstacles shall meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of AKC Regulations for Agility Trials. There will be no equipment familiarization at this trial. As of 9/1/06 AKC does not allow it.

The equipment for this event is provided by the Portland Agility Club.

## AWARDS, RIBBONS AND PRIZE INFORMATION

### Awards

Awards for qualifying scores only. All awards must be claimed at the show. Ribbons will be awarded to first through fourth place in each height division in each class.

First Place: Blue Ribbon ~ Second Place: Red Ribbon  
Third Place: Yellow Ribbon ~ Fourth Place: White Ribbon  
Qualifying Score: Dark Green Rosette

**MACH & PACH** ribbons and bars will be presented to dogs completing those titles. If you & your dog are close to a MACH or PACH, please let a member of the trial committee know.

**High in Trial (HIT):** Award will be a choice of vest or jacket with PAC Logo, HIT, and date up to \$55 in value, or a certificate for future entry to a PAC trial valued at \$55. Any additional add-on will be at expense of winner. HIT is for Master-level runs on Saturday only, to be awarded Sunday morning in the general briefing. The highest combined score from the STD and JWW rounds for small (8" & 12"), medium (16" & 20"), and large (24" & 24C") dogs in the regular classes, and small (4", 8" & 12") and medium (16" & 20") dogs in the preferred classes, will win. Qualifying scores in both classes are required with a score of 100 in both JWW and STD runs to be in contention. Scoring is based on the highest combined YPS. In case of a tie, the dog with the fastest YPS in the STD run will win. All prizes will be awarded during the trials though HIT awards will not be mailed.

**Perfect Day award:** Earning 4 Qs on Friday or 4 Qs on Saturday will receive an entry certificate worth 4 runs at a PAC trial. 4 Qs are defined as a Q in STD, JWW, Premier STD, and Premier JWW each on the same day.

**Class Level awards:** PAC will award a High Combined in Trial for each level for Saturday's STD and JWW qualifying runs. This is open to all dogs entered into the trial, regardless of breed. Award is a certificate for 2 runs at a future PAC trial and rosette. The dog's STD level determines level. In case of a tie of points, the dog with the highest average YPS will win, and if still a tie the dog with the fastest YPS in the STD run will win. **Excellent Level** (excludes Master): The highest scoring dog will be determined as the dog with a 2 run total closest to 200 in STD and JWW classes on Saturday's runs. **Open Level:** The highest scoring dog will be determined as the dog with a 2 run total closest to 200 in STD and JWW Classes on Saturday's runs. **Novice Level:** The highest scoring dog will be determined as the dog with a 2 run total closest to 200 in STD and JWW classes on Saturday's runs.

All prizes will be awarded during the trials and none will be mailed. Awards will only be given for qualifying scores. A rosette and jump bar will be offered to any dog completing a MACH or PACH at these trials.

## ELIGIBILITY AND JUMP HEIGHT DIVISIONS

### Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to all dogs 15 months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or are registerable breeds that have obtained PAL/ILP numbers from the American Kennel Club, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, blind dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. **Mixed breed dogs** listed in the AKC Canine Partners program are eligible to enter this all-breed AKC agility trial. Mixed breed dogs entered in these events must list the breed name as "Canine Partner" (mixed breed) and not as a breed hybrid and must include their AKC Canine Partners number on the entry form and check the AKC No. Box.

### Jump Height Information

All dogs without height cards will have to be measured by the judge of record, except 24"/24C" dogs. If a VMO or an AKC Representative is available, all dogs without height cards, including 24"/24C" dogs, will need to be measured. When filling out the entry form, there is a new section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog has a valid jump height card or if your dog needs to be measured. Please check the appropriate box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dogs on the *Dogs To Be Measured List*. ## FIX AND GO ON & FEO INFORMATION

### **Class Changes Effective January 1, 2020**

### **Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day**

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

### **Entering for Exhibition Only (FEO)**

- For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. As of July 1, 2024, FEO will be allowed in ALL classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.
- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).

### **Fix and Go On (FNG)**

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

## VOLUNTEERS

Please sign up at the trial.

**Volunteers** are the key to a successful trial and are greatly appreciated! We will ensure that your volunteer duties will not interfere with your runs. We will be using the white board system for volunteers. Please sign up to work when you can – **if everyone gave back to their fellow exhibitors and worked at least one class, we would easily have every job filled!** For every class worked, volunteers will receive a coupon that can be used towards future PAC trial entry fees or PAC gear! We'll also have a raffle just for the workers!

## EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

### Important Information for Exhibitors

- All owners and handlers are responsible for correctly entering and participating in this trial in accordance with AKC rules. Owners are responsible for errors in entry forms, regardless of who may make such errors.
- All dogs must be on leash at all times except when in the ring or when in the designated agility warm-up area. AKC does not permit pinch/prong collars, electrical or special training collars anywhere on the trial grounds.
- The safety of dogs is of primary concern. By entering the trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of the AKC agility program, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.
- Confirmation of entry and a schedule of judging time will be sent to the email address (when provided on the entry form) on the official AKC entry form after the closing date. If an exhibitor has not received a copy of the schedule at least seven days prior to the show, the trial secretary should be contacted. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. If a check is returned, the entry will be deemed invalid, and the issuer will be billed for all trial associated fees, including, but not limited to: AKC fees, judges fees and secretarial fees. **Envelopes/transactions containing entries for more than the ten (10) dog maximum shall be treated as an invalid entry.**
- Conditional, unsigned, incomplete, illegible, telephone or telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on official AKC forms or photocopies of AKC forms without the agreement form included are not acceptable.

- 100% of entry fees will be refunded if a **written request is received by the trial secretary on or before the trial closing date.** Exception for OLE processed through PayPal. OLE processing fees are non-refundable. After closing, refunds will be given, if notification is received not less than 48 hours prior to the start of the trial, less all fees, for injured or ill handlers, injured or ill dogs. Bitches in season will receive 100% refund. No refunds will be given if request is received after the published commencement of the trial. Verification from a doctor or vet may be required at the club's discretion. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, acts of God, public emergency, acts of public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- The Portland Agility Club and Clark County Fairgrounds assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or spectators, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to any child not under the control of his or her parents or guardians.
- The Portland Agility Club may cancel this event in extreme weather conditions.
- It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. All dogs must be on leash at all times except when in the ring or when in the designated agility warm-up area.
- Please clean up after your dogs while on the show grounds and at the motel site. We want to retain these facilities for future events.
- Only dogs that are eligible to be shown under the AKC rules shall be allowed within the show precincts.

### Ring & Crating Information

There is plenty of crating space inside the building around the arena.

### Agility Gate App

We will be using the Agility Gate App at this trial – the access code is **4303**. Please remember to Check-in your dog(s) for their run(s), mark them as a Conflict or FEO as needed, or Scratch them if you do not intend to run (you can do this from home).

I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly by any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the AKC Canine PartnersSM program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. 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## RV/LQ PARKING / TENT CAMPING GUIDELINES

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The Event Center does not have a campground. We offer designated spots as a convenience to show participants/exhibitors. These spots may have limited electric, but there are no hook-ups. Following are the guidelines for RV and tent camping on the grounds. Please ensure you are aware of all policies.

1. RV/LQ parking and tent camping is only available to show participants and vendors and may not be available for all events. Designated RV/LQ spots may have electric, and a few spots at the Arena have access to water, but **neither electric nor water is guaranteed**.
2. In most instances, units will not have power at their designated parking space as multiple outlets are located at each power source. Please bring an extension cord (minimum 50') and a 110-volt adapter.
3. Please be mindful of your power consumption, as more than one unit is sharing a breaker. The use of multiple appliances at one time may result in a loss of power for yourself and up to three other units.
4. Unless an event is ongoing, Event Center gates are locked at 5:00pm each night. Emergency exit is available through the Loading Dock gate. This gate is automatic and is activated by driving your vehicle over the area right in front of the gate (outlined in yellow). Once you leave the property, re-entry may not be available until 8:00am the next morning. Please ensure you know how to exit the grounds in case of emergency.
5. Only registered RVs may park in designated spaces. Due to limited space, it may be necessary to park support vehicles in exterior lots. Supply or livestock trailers must be disconnected from RVs and parked in the designated area(s).
6. The Event Manager has the authority to designate the location of each RV/Tent Camping spot, as well as have vehicles towed, and if necessary, request the removal of disruptive campers, or campers that are not following the guidelines set forth in this document.
7. No RVs or camping vehicles may be plugged into outlets inside buildings without prior FSMG approval.
8. Do not open gates, remove fencing or access any building other than those rented for the event you are participating in.
9. You must remain in the area rented by the Show Chair/Organizer and may not enter other areas.
10. Do not drive across or park in any grass areas without prior FSMG approval.
11. Absolutely **NO alcohol is permitted outside of RVs/Tents**. Any alcohol consumption outside of RVs/Tents may lead to being trespassed from the Fairgrounds.
12. NO open flame fires are permitted on the grounds.
13. Absolutely NO dumping of gray water or sewage on the grounds.
14. Dogs are not allowed in the restrooms at any time.
15. Courteous respect for other campers is expected. Quiet time is from one hour after the event ends until one hour prior to the event start time the next day.
16. If security personnel is onsite, they are present to ensure public safety. As such, they have access to any and all areas of the event.
17. Pets may not be tied outside RVs/Tents unattended and must be leashed at all times. If pets disturb other campers, it may become necessary to remove the pet from the Fairgrounds. Owners are responsible for care and clean-up after pets. Fairgrounds Site Management Group and Clark County will not assume any responsibility for pets.
18. Fairgrounds Site Management Group and Clark County, its employees, directors, officers and volunteers are held harmless against any lost, stolen or damaged units or items during the event.
19. Cancellation Policy: RV reservations may be cancelled a minimum of 48 hours prior to the event start date and a full refund issued upon request. Cancellations received less than 48 hours before the event start time are not refundable.
