Entries close on Wednesday, April 15, 2026, at 8:00 pm Pacific Time, after which time entries cannot be accepted, cancelled, altered, or substituted except as provided for in Chapter 11, Section 6 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows.

Envelopes/transactions containing entries for more than the ten (10) dog maximum and/ or entries received prior to the opening date shall be treated as an invalid entry and shall be returned to the sender.

All confirmations will be emailed. Please provide a legible email address on your entry.

ENTRY FEES - Make all checks and money orders payable to: BMDCA or Bernese Mountain Dog Club of America, Inc.

- \$41 for the first entry of each dog
- \$31 for the second entry of each dog
- \$26 for the third entry of each dog
- These fees include the \$4.50 AKC fee for each run.
- Returned check fee: \$30 will be charged for all returned checks. Repeat offenders will be required to submit entry fees by a money order.
- Entry changes, additions, corrections or cancellations **MUST** be received in writing or by email prior to the final closing date and time.

REFUNDS: Refunds for females that come in season and injured dogs after closing date will be refunded (minus a \$10.00 administration fee per day) if a veterinarian certificate is presented to the trial secretary prior to the start of judging. A full refund will be reimbursed to any entrant whose entry is replaced by a Wait-Listed entry. Refunds will not be issued because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of management if it is impossible to open or complete the show. No refunds for overpayments of \$10 or less. Entry fees shall not be refunded if a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by vet or judge, or barred from competition by action of the trial committee.

AKC DNA PROFILE NUMBER IS REQUIRED FOR ENTRY.

The BMDCA requires each entrant to provide a valid AKC DNA Profile Number for the dog entered on the Official Entry Form at time of entry. Failure to meet these requirements will render the dog ineligible to enter the event. This may result in the loss of all awards earned at the event, as well as subject the entrant to possible disciplinary action by the AKC and/or BMDCA, including but not limited to suspension from club privileges and entry of club events. All DNA numbers will be verified by the BMDCA within 30 days after the National Specialty. DNA kits can be obtained from the AKC Online Store at www.akc.org.

DON'T DELAY! STANDARD PROCESSING TIME IS 6-8 WEEKS AFTER RECEIPT!

If it has been more than 8 weeks since the DNA sample was submitted to AKC and you have not received a DNA profile number AND need it for your BMDCA Specialty entry, call AKC DNA Operations at 919-816-3508 to obtain a preliminary DNA number (accepted in extenuating circumstances only). Please allow sufficient time for the AKC to receive your sample and call NO LATER THAN one week prior to close of entries. Be sure to mention "BMDCA National Specialty" to expedite your request.

DIRECTIONS: From the Linn County Expo Center site, get on Interstate 5 heading north.

- Drive north for 6.5 miles
- Take Exit 244 towards North Jefferson
- Drive .2 miles and turn right onto Jefferson Hwy.
- Go 250 feet and turn right onto Enchanted Way SE.
- Drive 2.4 miles and then turn right onto Cloverdale DR SE.
- Drive .4 miles and turn right onto Ridgeway DR SE.
- Drive .5 miles. The facility will be on your right.

SITE INFORMATION

- **CRATING:** There is crating space inside the building
- **SURFACE:** Packed sand surface typical of barns used for agility. No animals use this SURFACE; it's strictly an agility barn.
- **DOG POTTY:** Plenty of grassy areas right outside the barn.
- **PARKING:** There's ample parking close to the barn and it's close enough to crate in your vehicle if you prefer.
- **PORTA POTTIES:** There are two. One is located near the arena and one near the parking.
- **SET UP:** Morning of the show only- Location is approx. 20 minutes from the show site.
- Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s) at the site and at the hotels. Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

HIGH IN TRIAL CALCULATION

Two High in Trial awards shall be offered: One for the Regular classes and one for the Preferred classes. Both HIT awards shall be calculated in the same manner according to a point system. The trial secretary and/or chair will post results where they will be easily visible. ALL classes count towards the HIT awards. Points will be calculated as follows:

Each Q.....	5 points
First Place	additional 5 points
Second Place	additional 3 points
Third Place	additional 2 points
Fourth Place.....	additional 1 point

Ties will be broken using the results from the STD class. First, the team that Q'd, and second, the team with the most points earned (full seconds under time). If there is still a tie, we will move to the JWW class results (Q and points). Only one HIT shall be awarded for Regular and one for Preferred.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

Obstacles: Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility. The warm-up area contains a regulation agility jump and is available to all exhibitors.

Eligibility to Compete: Trial is limited to Bernese Mountain Dogs. As it states in the Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 1, Section 3, all Bernese Mountain Dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Services (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate except bitches in heat, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. Dogs or registerable breeds with accepted foreign registration numbers are eligible to participate.

Safety/Behavior: Dog safety is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to ensure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring that their dogs are in the proper physical and mental condition to run safely.

Liability: It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor, exhibitor's dogs and/or children that create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the event committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The club and its agents, employees, etc., will not assume responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the club or any official thereof.

Leashes: All dogs must always be on leash when on the trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course. While running, there are two options:

Option 1: The Leash Runner will use a "grabber" to move your leash to the end of the course. Your leash will be placed in the bucket.

Option 2: You can place your leash in your pocket, around your neck, or around your

waist per AKC. If the dog grabs the leash while running, this will be scored as an "E".

Course Maps: Course maps will be posted the morning of the trial.

Ringside: Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, they must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class. All dogs not needed for further judging may leave the trial. Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The owner of each dog is solely responsible for having the dog ready at ringside when it is to be judged. Unentered dogs should not be ringside.

Waiver of Rights: *Animals in Distress:* The Bernese Mountain Dog Club of America, Inc. reserves the right to remove any animal in distress from a parked vehicle or crate, and all persons attending these dog events hereby waive any claim for damages against the clubs for such removal. The Club regards the health, safety and life of any dog on the show grounds to be paramount to other property or privacy rights. We will attempt to reach the responsible party but cannot guarantee contact will be made before action is taken.

Class Changes - Eff. January 1, 2020

Entering a Mixture of Regular and Preferred Classes Within the Same Trial Weekend – Multiple Jump Heights Within the Same Trial Day

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers with Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day.

Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

- For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is allowed in all classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.
- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered at any level (Novice, Open Excellent or Masters) in FAST, JWW, Standard or Premier classes. If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out to the scribe and the judge.

- Course time for FEO in Time 2 Beat, JWW, Standard, Premier and ISC will be 45 seconds. FAST courses times for each class/height are as noted in the Regulations.

Fix and Go On (FNG)

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run.

FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog.

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice **height division** for all **Regular** titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the **Preferred** classes **must** compete at the required jump height and **may not** compete in a jump height division **higher or lower** than their proper height division. All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial *or back-to-back trials* only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine PartnersSM** program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.
